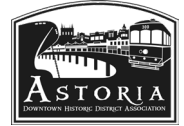

1. Angi D Wildt Gallery

The Bill W Dodge Exhibition continues including other artist's work from his private collection. Paintings; photography; marble, wood & glass mosaic sculptures; blown glass, fused glass art, jewelry; prints from 20 artists featured.

2. Ashriver Woodworks

Ashriver Woodworks takes woodworking and epoxy work to the next level. Along with local artists we offer a tempting display of beautiful items for your home and business. Work with us to create customized furniture and projects as well!

3. Astoria Visual Arts Cathy Stearns: Elemental Breath & Brian Evans: Distant Light

AVA welcomes local artists Cathy Stearns and Brian Evans who each use expressive signature styles to create their work. Stearns' exhibit, Elemental Breath, explores the power and beauty of the ocean with a free range of orchestral color. Evans' collective work, titled Distant Light, references the guiding force that informs his intuitive process. AVA is a nonprofit organization that works to support the arts throughout Greater Astoria.

4. Brumfield Gallery Jen Crowe

Jen Crowe begins our 2023 program. Jen is our only abstract artist, working in oil and cold wax. Originally a weaver she has an innate understanding of how to layer color to create an evocative surface.

7. Imogen Gallery The Biopsy Revisited

During the month of January, we welcome the photography of Aaron Johanson who brings 20 stunning black and white prints that he created in his Portland studio. Johanson worked as a photographer for a Japanese publishing firm and also as a freelance photographer in Japan for several years before opening his own studio here in his native Oregon. In this body of work, Johanson demonstrates his deft use of lighting and traditional printing techniques to produce a beautiful and unusual depiction of plant life. By isolating his subject matter and stripping it down to its bare essentials, Johanson lets us appreciate natural form through the inherent beauty of large format, traditional black and white film photography. Aaron Johanson will be available to answer questions about his work from 5 - 8 pm.

9. RiverSea Gallery Lindsey Aarts and Noel Thomas featured to benefit AVA

RiverSea Gallery presents two exhibitions by local artists to benefit Astoria Visual Arts. In Cork and Lead: Telling the Gillnet Story, Lindsey Aarts delves into the rich history of commercial gillnet fishing on the lower Columbia River. Months of research and first-person interviews conducted while artist-in-residence at AVA laid the foundation for these conceptual collage and watercolor illustrations that offer a glimpse into the heyday of gillnet fishing, an era that helped form this region. Aarts experiments with relationships between image and text in this compelling series

In the Alcove, Noel Thomas exhibits watercolors and drawings specially selected to benefit the AVA Miss Bea Fund for young artists. The artist is generously donating a percentage of each sale to the fund, and RiverSea Gallery is donating a portion of profits to AVA on artwork sold in both exhibitions through February 7, 2023.

Tyler Pierce of Remington Woodworks enjoys using Pacific Northwest woods to create unique vessels. He strives to accentuate the organic beauty of the material while bringing a modern sense of design. When he isn't in the shop, Tyler enjoys searching for unique wood for his next creation.
