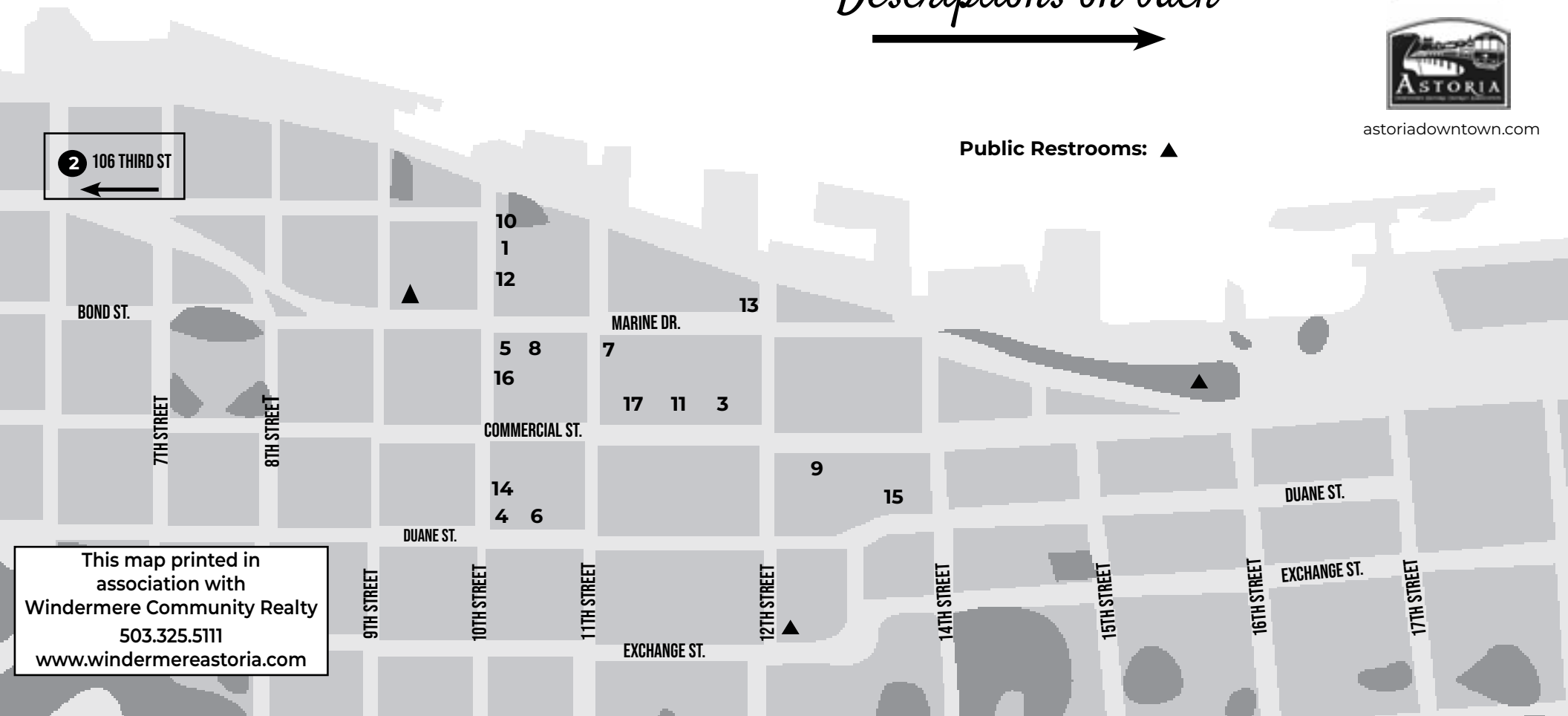

February 10, 2024 Descriptions

1. Angi D Wildt Gallery *Seascapes by Nikole Rae Peacock*

Local artist, Nikole Rae Peacock, will present new seascapes in the gallery for Artwalk. Kathy Ero has increased her display of jewelry in the gallery, perfect for you or your Valentine! Ero is donating her proceeds from sales to 'The Astoria Riverbots'. The gallery represents 25 artists, working in the mediums of painting, sculpture, blown-glass, jewelry, photography, prints, and cards.

2. ARTstoria *Time To Explore*

Feeling the winter blues? While in the heart of downtown, come upstairs to a little corner of the world that's full of color and creativity! You'll find landscapes, wildlife, architecture, flowers...the Pacific Northwest represented on canvas. Besides original paintings, we have prints, cards, journals, scarves, and home decor. Open 1-7 pm.

3. Astoria Art Loft *New Year's Potpourri*

The studio home for a number of gifted artists, Astoria Art Loft features an exhibit of work created on site. Oils, fused glass, zentangle, collage, photography, watercolor, graphite, and more await visitors. Unique framing from Artists' Hall of Frames is also on display. 1 p.m. - 4 p.m.

4. Astoria Visual Arts *Fish Tales*

Each year in February fisher poets come from coast to coast to pay homage to the mighty salmon and the commercial fishing industry during the annual Fisher Poets Gathering. Regional artists also pay homage to our friends with fins at Astoria Visual Arts for "Fish Tales", a community exhibit featuring photography, printmaking, sculpture, carving, ceramics, painting, and written word, among others, all celebrating fish.

5. Brumfield Gallery *Karen Abel Ceramics*

Karen Abel's hand-built and slab-built ceramic sculptures often feature textured surfaces with scenes influenced by the PNW landscape. The theme for this new body of work is the idea of finding sanctuary from the storm. The gallery also has new sculptures by Suzanne Long and still life paintings by Katherine Ace.

6. Cambium Gallery *A Body Apart*

Cambium Gallery is excited to welcome Astoria based artist Amie Pascal for the solo show 'A Body Apart'. 'A Body Apart' delves into betrayals of the body, in all its bountiful guts and beautiful gore through abstract and surreal compositions referencing old medical anatomy to expose what it feels like going through this world in a sick, broken body and queer being. A reception will be held from 5 pm to 8 pm and artist will be present.

7. Imogen Gallery *Far From Home*

In conjunction with the annual FisherPoets Gathering, we are proud to present the powerful photographic work of commercial fisherman and artist Corey Arnold. Arnold brings an incredible collection of large-scale photographic prints, narrating his work experiences in Alaska, both on the Bering Sea and Bristol Bay. His up close and intimate look at the working environment is an inspiration with a solid nod of respect to those who depend on the sea for livelihood. Arnold is a Hallie Ford Foundation Fellow as well as a National Geographic Explorer. His work can be found in the permanent collection of the Portland Art Museum as well as many other private, corporate, and public collections. .

8. LightBox Photographic Gallery *The Photographic Nude*

Dedicated in memory of and to the creative spirit of Ruth Bernhard, this juried exhibit explores the artistic and creative view of the body and its form, celebrating the nude in photography by embracing a variety of styles. Michael Puff, a Guild at LightBox member juried The Photographic Nude 2024 in its 12th year. Also on exhibit is the work of The Guild at LightBox. Jody Miller, Julie Moore, Loren Nelson, Marc McVey, Jim Fitzgerald, Sam Blair, Michael Puff and Rachel Wolf are the photographic artists that exhibit in the LightBox upper galleries. 9. Made in Astoria *The Sea Monster Show*

Sea monster lore has captured imaginations for hundreds of years and this community exhibit brings these stories to life. Sightings off the Columbia Bar and along the Oregon Coast occurred from the 1930s - 1960s with Colossal Claude being one of the sea monsters seen enough to earn a name. Claude was described as a 40-foot-long animal with a horse-shaped head, an eight foot long neck, a big round body, and long tail. See "Colossal Claude" by metal sculptor Dustin Nord along with an array of paintings and mixed media pieces by regional artists.

10. Paul Polson Studio Gallery *Paul Polson Paintings*

Water-based paintings of Europe and the Northwest will be shown along with new oil paintings. Large oils of surrealistic and strata themes, both old and new, will also be presented.

11. RiverSea Gallery *Deep Dive*

RiverSea Gallery presents Deep Dive, a solo show by Oregon Coast printmaker and poet Duncan Berry, whose eloquent gyotaku prints capture the rhythm of the sea. Inspired by life at the wild edge of the continent, Berry creates print impressions taken directly from the inked surface of ocean creatures and plants. In this collection, he takes us on an immersive journey into the mysterious underwater realm just off our coastline. In addition to the familiar fish living near the surface, he includes expressive images of a beautiful and bizarre menagerie of ocean creatures that live beyond the reach of light, 5000 feet under the swell of the waves. The fantastical forms of these majestic denizens of the deep stoked the imagination of ancient seafarers to inspire myths, legends, and songs that live on today. View the show from 12:00 – 8:00 and meet the artist from 5:00 – 8:00 with libations and refreshments, plus musicians John Orr and Clarence Robinson. The artwork will remain on view through March 5, 2024.

12. West Coast Artisans *Celebrating Water*

West Coast Artisans is celebrating everything that goes on in the water that surrounds Astoria, above and below the surface. Photographs and paintings of the boats that sail the waters of our rivers as well as images of the fish that swim below (or maybe just in our imaginations) will be on display along with art from many other local artists.

13. Astoria Brewing Company Taproom *Astoria Photography by Tracey*

Local photographer, Tracy Phinney, loves photographing the world in its natural beauty. The collection hanging mostly focuses on macro photography with a few other touches to the collection.

14. Astoria Studio Collective *Poetry Reading*

The Astoria Studio Collective is hosting poetry readings by Cliff Taylor, Kaisa Saavalainen and Elisa Carlsen. Other studio collective artists will have their studios open to display their work as well. Join us upstairs at 372 10th Street (next to Frank's Barber Shop). We will be open from 5-8 pm. Poetry readings will be from 6:00 to 7:30.

15. Bridge and Tunnel Bottleshop *Andee Gowing*
